

Arts Décoratifs is the movement in decorative arts and architecture that originated in Europe in the 1920s and was further developed and popularized in the U.S. during the 1930s. The name derives from the Exposition

Internationale des Arts Décoratifs et Industriels Modernes, where the design style was first exhibited in Paris in 1925.


Influenced formatively by other art styles such as Art Nouveau, the Bauhaus, Cubism and the Ballets Russes. It is founded on mathematical geometric shapes, Art Deco designs are characterized by trapezoidal, zigzagged, and triangular shapes, chevron patterns, stepped forms, sweeping curves, and sunburst motifs. Art Deco is also derived from Egyptian and American Indian decorative sources.

Materials vary, especially today. From aluminum, stainless steel, plastics, lacquer and inlaid wood to plastic, glass.

Unfortunately, the use of organic materials such as horn, ivory, sharkskin, and zebra skins was also popular in the early years of production.
